### SELECTION OF THE RESPONDENTS:

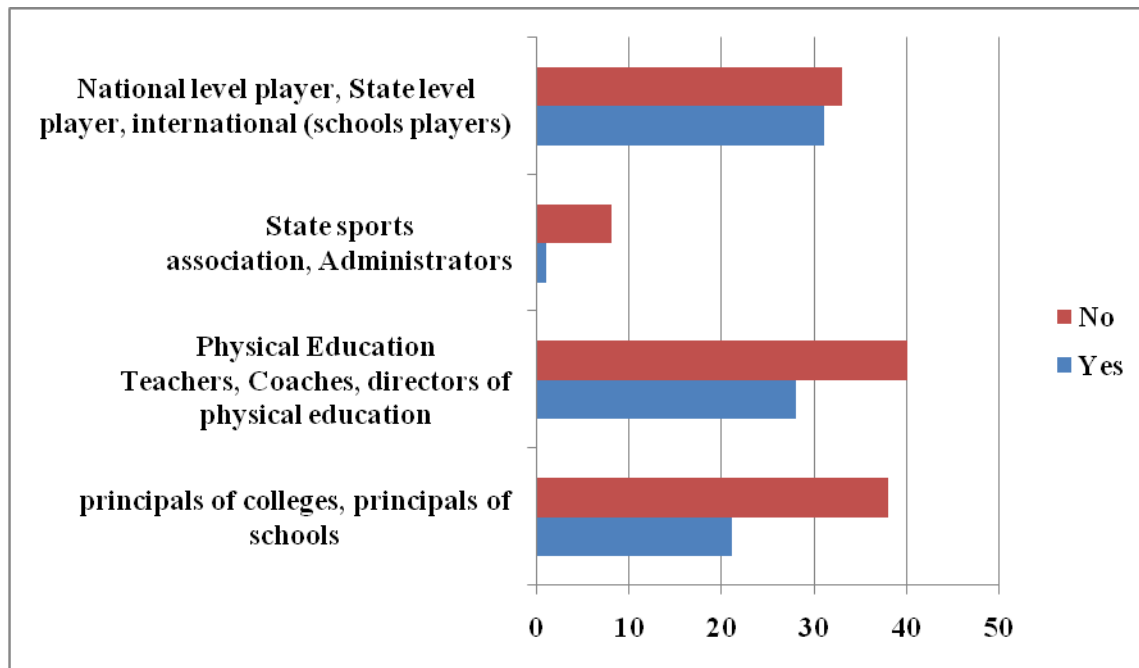

A well-prepared two questionnaire was framed consisting of 13 questions relating to various aspects and problems. The questions were of heterogeneous type in the sense that some questions were open ended, some were of scaling and some were for suggestions.

Among those holding the other view (17.5%), were 13 (principals of colleges and principals of schools), 8 (directors of physical education, Physical Education Teachers and Coaches), 2 (State sports association and Administrators) and 12 (National level player, State level player and international schools players). In response to the question, "Are the Hockey Federations & Associations working properly for development of Hockey in Haryana?". 82.5% respondents answered in negative. Those holding this view included 46 principals of colleges, principals of schools, 60 directors of physical education, Physical Education Teachers, Coaches, 7 State sports association, Administrators and 52 National level player, State level player, international schools players.

Among those holding the other view (31%), were 17 (principals of colleges and principals of schools), 23 (directors of physical education, Physical Education Teachers and Coaches), 3 (State sports association and Administrators) and 19 (National level player, State level player and international schools players). In response to the question, "Do you agree that female Hockey players of Haryana is provided the same facilities which his counterpart in those game which are performing well in Haryana?". 68% respondents answered in negative. Those holding this view included 42 principals of colleges, principals of schools, 45 directors of physical education, Physical Education Teachers, Coaches, 6 State sports association, Administrators and 45 National level player, State level player, international schools players.

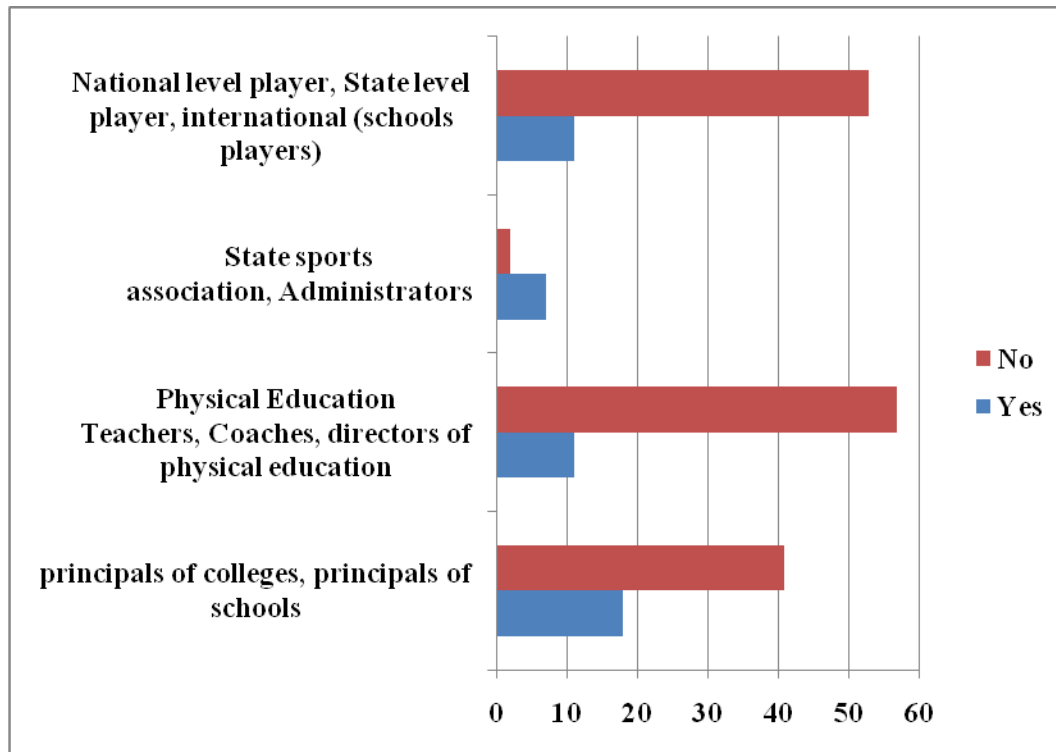

In response to the question “Whether the Hockey Federations & Associations are starved of funds in comparison to other federations?”, the respondents were in favour (54.5%), were 34 (principals of colleges and principals of schools), 31 (directors of physical education, Physical Education Teachers and Coaches), 8 (State sports association and Administrators) and 36 (National level player, State level player and international schools players).

The 45.50% respondents who were not in the favour included 25 principals of colleges, principals of schools, 37 directors of physical education, Physical Education Teachers, Coaches, 1 State sports association, Administrators and 28 National level player, State level player, international schools players.

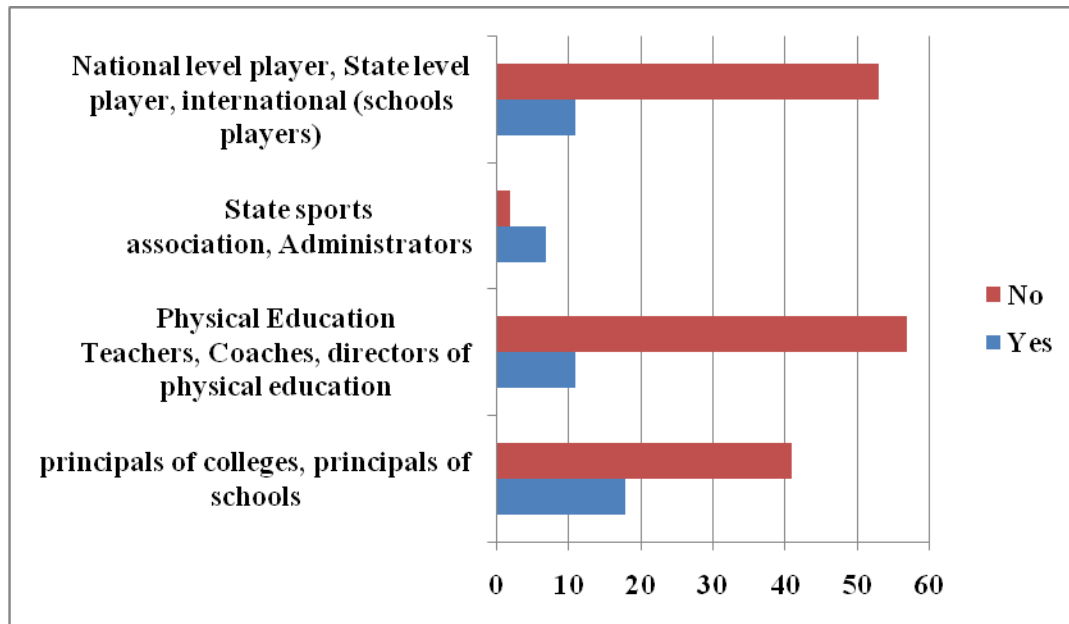

### CONCLUSION AND SUGGESTIONS:

India is a developing country more than 70.00% of whose population resides in rural areas and more than 40.00% is below the poverty line. Most of the people in both these categories have very low level of awareness and even if they have awareness they cannot afford to show and polish their talents. Consequently, a vast treasure of talent in Indian either untargeted or diverted to unproductive works or remains hidden. Thus they may approach the public sector undertakings and big business houses in the private sector for seeking financial assistance. For instance they may convince these organizations to adopt the Indian Hockey team (and thus bear the entire expenditure of their training, coaching and dieting etc.) turn-by-turn. The government can provide boost to such activities by giving certain incentives like tax- benefits to these funding organizations.
